# See You Next Week

ON THE LAST WEDNESDAY in Lent, 1997, a young couple newly arrived from Winnipeg happened in at St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Kitchener, Ontario. Richard offered them coffee and invited them to stay for the potluck supper being laid out on the table. At the end of the meal Daryl and Cindy said, "See you next week." But Lent was ending—there would be no "next week."

Ten years later "next week" continues, with 80 or more neighbourhood guests and volunteers sitting down to table every Wednesday. Along with various other kinds of ministry, the suppers constitute what became Community Ministry.

*See You Next Week* is the story—really, a mosaic of stories by both the helping and the helped—of one downtown ministry to, and with, some of the ever increasing number of persons marginalised by our pell-mell society.

It's a not untypical story. Historic mainline churches with aging buildings and aging memberships, nestled among bustling modern institutions, reach out into the neighbourhood. The personal, sometimes intimate, stories in *See You Next Week* demonstrate a response to the Bible's imperatives to minister to the poor and afflicted while also calling to mind the Bible's many calls to do justice.
